



FISHING HARBOUR
of

Acciaroli - Pollica (Sa)



The intervention is managed by the Commune of Pollica and has a cost of around 1.3 million Euros. It is financed by the Campania Regional Operational Programme (ROP).

The project beneficiaries are the fishermen of Acciaroli, who own about 70 boats, of which 50 are dedicated to small-scale coastal fishing.

Completion of the work is due in December 2003. From the summer of 2003, the port of Acciaroli has been on one of the routes operated by the Metrò del Mare, connecting the Neapolitan port of Beverello to Capri, Acciaroli, Palinuro, Marina di Camerota and Sapri.

The port of Acciaroli, one of the most important of the Cilento coastline, is part of an area of particular environmental value within the National Park of the same name. The Cilento rural plan foresees a number of interventions affecting the Acciaroli locality, aimed at the recovery of port areas and the creation of services to encourage commercial fishing. The most significant aspects of the project relate to the adoption of modern unloading systems for the boats, and the purification of the water used to clean them, by means of static separation of non-emulsified oily substances (e.g. used lubricants). An unused school on the harbourside has been restored and converted into a hygienic centre to receive the fish caught.

The project, although financed by the Financial Instrument for Fisheries Guidance (FIFG), which is specifically for the fishing industry, aims to have a wider impact. The port's modernisation is complemented by the relaunching of tourism and hotel activities, thanks also to the environmental improvement of the National Park.
